FOOD For Lane County	Food System expansion to address food insecurity	Comprehensive collaborative effort to expand the current food system in Lane County to improve health quality, address ethnic, cultural and racial disparities for those who access food by utilizing food pantries and other low-barrier means.
Upper Willamette Soil & Water Conservation District	Food System expansion to address food insecurity	Comprehensive collaborative effort to expand the current food system in Lane County by working directly with farmers to improve health quality, and address ethnic, cultural and racial disparities for those who grow food in Lane County.
Bushnell University	Healthcare Workforce: Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing program	Expansion of the Accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing program, including increased scholarship availability for nursing students with an emphasis on BIPOC students, and increased opportunities to bring BIPOC faculty into the organization.
Lane Community College	Healthcare Workforce: Health Professions programs	Support expansion of the Health Professions Program through acquisition of culturally appropriate learning resources and scholarships for students in Health Professions programs.

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Lane County Health & Human Services	Family Connects	Universally-offered registered nurse postpartum in-home assessment and referral connection program for families with a newborn that reduces emergency room medical care, increases care coordination, and reduces geographic disparities in access to supportive systems.
Lane County Health & Human Services	Mobile Behavioral Health Crisis program	Support for the mobile behavioral health crisis program in Lane County.
Laurel Hill Center	FUSE Outreach Supportive Outreach Teams	Support of outreach and transportation for high-need FUSE (Frequent Users of System Engagement) participants.
Lane County Human Services Division	Rural Outreach Supportive Outreach Teams	Support for outreach and transportation for rural participants, including basic needs.
Multiple Agencies: St. Vincent DePaul, Catholic Community Services of Lane County, 211Info	Severe Weather Supports	Support severe weather supports, transportation and coordination to access these services in Lane County.

Multiple Agencies: Equitable Social Solutions, Mainstream Housing	Emergency Shelter Support	Support operations for emergency shelter programs including Mainstream Pallets and Shankle Brooklyn Street Shelter.
OSLC Developments (15th Night)	Traditional Health Worker Billing Hub	Support the creation of a Traditional Health Worker (THW) Billing Hub to identify pathways and provide technical assistance for billing for clinical partners.
