



Lane Community Health Council Youth Behavioral Health Grant

The Lane Community Health Council (LCHC) works in partnership with PacificSource Community Solutions Lane County Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) to fund and support initiatives that improve the health and wellness of the Lane County CCO. LCHC is pleased to announce that applications for our 2024 Youth Behavioral Health Grant funding are open as of **Tuesday, January 9 at 5pm PST and will run through Tuesday, February 13 at 5pm PST.**

Grant Focus Area

One of the primary goals of this grant process is to fund innovative projects that address priority areas identified by the Lane Community Health Council. For this application process, we are focused on the following priority area:

- **Youth & Family Behavioral Health services, specifically:**
 - Programs that focus on prevention **and/or** intervention activities

Funding Specifics

For the Youth Behavioral Health Grant process, there is room for innovation and creativity in program development and expansion. However, we want to call attention to a few key points that may help you in the application process.

- This funding is intended to primarily cover costs involved in the creation of new programs or the expansion of current programs.
- This funding is **not** intended to cover bricks & mortar/building costs.
- This funding is **not** intended to cover provider credentialing or marketing expenses.
- This funding is **not** intended to cover Medicaid-reimbursable Direct Services.

This funding is intended for activities or programs that:

- Improve Health Outcomes
 - This may include but is not limited to:
 - Expenses associated with identifying and addressing ethnic, cultural or racial disparities in effectiveness of identified best clinical practices and evidence-based medicine.
 - Effective case management, care coordination, and chronic disease management

- Implement, Promote and Increase Wellness and Health Promotion Activities
 - This may include but is not limited to:
 - Wellness/lifestyle coaching programs designed to achieve specific and measurable improvements.
 - Coaching or education programs and health promotion activities designed to change behaviors (i.e., smoking, obesity).

Additional Information

- This is a competitive grant process, and we will accept project requests **up to** \$500,000.
 - This is a maximum ask. Organizations are welcome to apply for smaller awards or partial funding if that is applicable to their program needs.
 - Please note that the spend-down time for this funding is over the course of one year.
 - Applying organizations should be able to speak to the long-term (three- to five year) sustainability of their project.
- These funds will be spent between April 30, 2024, and April 30, 2025.
- Additionally, LCHC will prioritize funding projects that focus on serving Black, Indigenous, and people of color (BIPOC) populations as well as populations in rural areas of Lane County.

Through the Youth Behavioral Grant, the LCHC will award funding for selected projects that meet the criteria. Applications will open on January 9 5pm PST and close on February 13 5pm PST.
