



Lane Community Health Council Spring 2026 Community Grants

Request for Proposals (RFP)

If you have previously applied for an award from LCHC, please review this RFP carefully as some funding specifics have changed!

The Lane Community Health Council (LCHC) has worked in partnership with PacificSource Community Solutions Lane County Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) to fund and support initiatives that improve the health and wellness of the Lane County region. LCHC is pleased to announce that applications for our Spring 2026 Community Grant funding are open as of **FRIDAY, MARCH 20 at 4pm PST and will run through THURSDAY, APRIL 9 at 11:59pm PST.**

Timeline

LCHC will accept grant applications from March 20 through April 9, 2026. Awards will be announced in May 2026.

Grant Focus Area

One of the primary goals of this grant process is to fund programs and projects that address priority areas identified by the Lane Community Health Council and align with the needs of the community. For this application process, we are focused on the following priority areas:

- **Delivering equitable, medically necessary care and services to populations disproportionately impacted by access barriers, specifically:**
 - Programs that focus on refugee/immigrant populations, and/or
 - Programs that focus on LGBTQ+, specifically trans, youth.
- **Housing supports**
- **Behavioral Health supports, specifically:**
 - Programs that focus on prevention (substance use, suicide, mental health concerns, etc.).
- **Food Insecurity**
 - This may include food security efforts, food insecurity, or food sovereignty efforts.
- **Healthcare Workforce**

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- Projects that demonstrate the following will be given additional consideration:
 - Projects that have previously been awarded LCHC funding.
 - Projects that emphasize culturally responsive and linguistically appropriate principles.
 - Projects that emphasize equity in their development and planning.
 - Projects serving rural areas of Lane County.
 - Projects that address multiple priority areas.

Funding Specifics

For the Spring Community Grant process, we want to call attention to a few key funding requirements and restrictions that may help you in the application process.

- Applicants for this funding **must** serve Medicaid members & the HOP population.
- This funding is intended to serve majority Lane County residents.
- This funding is intended to primarily cover costs involved in the expansion of current programs that align with at minimum one of the above grant focus area(s).

Additional Information

- This is a competitive grant process, and we will accept project requests **up to \$250,000**.
 - Organizations are welcome to apply for smaller awards or partial funding if that is applicable to their program needs.
- Applying organizations should be able to speak to the long-term (three- to five year) sustainability of their project.
