

Lane Community Health Council Community Benefit Initiative 2022 Recipients

Lane Community Health Council is pleased to announce the recipients of our 2022 Community Initiative (CBI) funding. Through this program, Lane Community Health Council in partnership with PacificSource Community Solutions has invested \$460,000 in the community to address community health needs, including early childhood development, youth mental and behavioral health, gender affirming healthcare, food security, mobile primary care, resources for communities impacted by wildfires, and low-barrier healthcare services for marginalized communities in Lane County.

2022 CBI Recipients & Projects:

- **Relief Nursery** support for the Therapeutic Early Childhood Program to support children and their families so that children can enter Kindergarten ready to learn.
- **TransPonder** provide access to gender affirming resources and products.
- Kids First increase access to evidence-based mental health screening for trauma symptoms, evidence-informed sexual abuse prevention curriculum, culturally specific outreach to the Spanish-speaking community, and resources such as a free library, onsite clothing, and hygiene products for children in need.
- **Community Sharing Program** increase access to the backpack program to address growing food insecurity needs in the South Lane School District.
- Lane School support students with complex social, emotional, and/or behavioral health needs that have impacted their ability to find success in their home school through evidence-based practices.
- HIV Alliance support for the Harm Reduction Program to sustain and enhance harm reduction and integrated, low-barrier healthcare services for marginalized communities in Lane County, including expansion of services in Cottage Grove, Oak Ridge, and other rural areas.



- Additional Projects

- Mobile Primary Care Lane Community Health Council has purchased two rapid deployment shelter tents to support community partners in mobile primary care needs. Further information on the availability of this resource will be available soon!
