Examples of areas of work in Lane County are the Community Health Assessment, Community Health Improvement Plan and Lane County Community Advisory Council and related subcommittees. The Community Health Program Manager will manage this work in accordance with LCHC's bylaws, as well as all applicable statutory rule and contract requirements.

Education/Work Experience

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited four-year college or university that specializes in the public health, healthcare or human service field; AND one (1) year of professional experience; OR
 - Any satisfactory equivalent combination of education, training and/or experience relevant to the position including a human services or healthcare Associates degree with related training and/or experience.
- Knowledge of and experience with the healthcare community and community based organizations in Lane County or demonstrated ability to foster relationships within the community.
- Experience and/or training in community-based health programs, preferred.
- Working knowledge of Oregon's Medicaid system and the roles and responsibilities of Coordinated Care Organizations, preferred.

Special Requirements

- Possess a current driver's license in Lane County and an acceptable driving record and is able and willing to drive for LCHC business.
